TANZANIA OUTREACH CAMP

This June, 391 kids and leaders went to outreach camp in Arusha, Tanzania. This number included 76 Muslims, 97 girl and 218 boy campers. 231 kids made a commitment to Jesus at the end of camp, including 25 Muslim campers.

One camper was Brenda, a 17-year-old girl from Arusha. For a long time, she had a very painful relationship with her mother. Her mother was abusive and Brenda developed a sense of hatred for her. In January, Brenda met a Young Life leader named Nisetha. Nisetha showed Brenda the love that she had lacked and longed for, which led the two to become great friends. Brenda came to camp with Nisetha where she heard the gospel and gave her life to Jesus Christ, accepting Him as her personal Lord and Savior. Brenda returned home to forgive her mom for all that she has done to Brenda.

ZANZIBAR OUTREACH CAMP

335 kids gathered for a Young Life camp in Zanzibar. 182 of these kids came from Muslim backgrounds. The camp was full of family-styled meals around the table, outrageous games and the life-transforming good news called Jesus!

One camper, Ali, grew up in a Muslim family and loves playing football (soccer). In January, a local Young Life leader started going to the field where Ali and his friends would play football each day. They were nervous that this leader was the owner of the field and that he was going to be upset with them for playing there. They approached him to ask if he was indeed the owner and they were surprised when he said "no" - he simply loved watching Ali and his friends play. Ali was so surprised because most adults in Zanzibar do not spend time with teenagers. Eventually, Ali's leader invited him to attend a Young Life camp. Ali agreed!

At first, Ali seemed like he was not having a good time at all. However, on day two after hearing the camp speaker talk on Jesus' love and forgiveness, Ali knew that he needed to share with his leader what was burdening him. Ali told his leader, "Before you moved to our neighborhood, there was a man who would ride his bicycle through the streets every day. He would always greet us and say 'Praise the Lord!' We hated him because he was a Christian. We would tell him, 'Stop greeting us in name of your Lord Jesus! We will not praise Him!' He continued to greet us in this way and so one day as he passed by we took stones and badly stoned him. Now, here at camp I heard about the love of Jesus and I feel so sorry for what I have done. I wish that he would forgive me." Ali's leader asked Ali if he wanted to accept Jesus into his heart. He said 'yes' and was forever changed!
