## Dear Friends,

Our first year as vice presidents is coming to a close, and it is with humble and grateful hearts that we reflect on all God's work across Africa and the Middle East. In October 2019, we took on these new roles as the first African vice presidents in Young Life's history. While we are divided geographically as Africa East, Africa West, Africa South and North Africa/Middle East, we are united in our mission: to transform Africa and the Middle East through Jesus-centered, disciple-making leaders. Together, we are pioneering new ministries, growing up leadership trees and building relationships near and farall in hopes of making the gospel known to kids. Together, we bring different kinds of gifts, but we know it is the same Spirit who leads all of us. Together, we are stepping out in faith, moving forward to reach our goals and clinging to the hope we have in God's promises. Together, we believe the greatest leaders are the ones who give generously and serve wholeheartedly. We seek to model our leadership after Jesus, serving our staff and leaders so that in return they can love and care for kids.

This past year, our communities experienced violence, religious persecution, fundraising challenges, strikes, joblessness, poverty and the lasting effects of a global pandemic. These leaders are the heart behind our mission and they invest powerfully in their communities. their lives by traveling to bring the gospel to new places. Others sought out orphans, refugees, teen-moms, teens with disabilities, those in prison and those most impacted by COVID-19. As a mission, we continue to raise up women leaders despite continuous social and political obstacles. Kids without hope are meeting Jesus through Young Life and in return bringing hope home to their families and communities. The Spirit of God is at work, uniting us as we further the kingdom, go the extra mile and reach more kids.

We never expected to lead in these roles—our heart has always been simply to share the gospel. Steve Larmey (Group Senior Vice President) left big shoes for us to fill, yet we are grateful that he and others continue to walk alongside us. God has not left us as orphans in our new positions. Praise Him who is aligning us together so that we lead as one. Together, we thank God for you, an integral part of this body. Because of your support—your generosity, your prayer, your friendship—we continue to reach kids, develop leaders and transform communities. 

### JAMES DAVIS AFRICA WEST

James is a passionate and prayerful leader. At the age of 16, James found himself hiding from enemies in the midst of a civil war in his home country of Liberia. Here, James promised God that if He kept James safe, he would commit his life to serving Him. The Lord answered, and James kept his promise. Soon after, James joined a church and began a youth group for kids in his neighborhood. After stumbling upon a Young Life story in a magazine, James asked the Lord to start Young Life in Liberia. At the time, rebel forces controlled most of the country. James was asking for nothing less than a miracle and God

provided. James and his friends gave from their own pockets to begin ministry in a neighborhood, and fund a child soldiers rehabilitation camp. In 2003, the war ended, peace came and Young Life began in Liberia. James and his wife Gloria live in Monrovia. Liberia with their two children.

Originally from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Alexis saw his village destroyed in a tribal war fueled by outside countries hungry for gold and diamonds. Separated for months after fleeing from rebels, his family reunited in a refugee camp in Uganda. Alexis is resilient and courageous. He attended university in Kenya. There, he became one of the first leaders

to bring Young Life ministry to Africa. Alexis then moved to Tanzania to begin ministry in one of the most difficult neighborhoods in Arusha. He now lives in Dar es Salaam with his wife Jacqueline and their two daughters. "Just like the men in the boat, I've been very scared to go out of my comfort zone...But Lord, I will trust you." – Alexis

# Responding to COVID-19

When COVID-19 hit the globe, many resorted to virtual communication. But in countries where data plans are limited and internet connection is often unstable, Young Life leaders in Africa and the Middle East needed to be a little more innovative. This began with inviting our entire community across the globe to join us in praying Psalm 91 for 91 days, just as we did during the 2014 Ebola crisis. We prayed for protection, healing, courage and vision to keep reaching and teaching kids. We also prayed that God would open doors and serve through our team on the ground, and that kids would experience the power of Jesus when they least expected it. God answered

our prayers! On our 91st day, we watched almost 28,000 people engage in prayer and worship. From March 11th to June 10th, leaders reached 32,046 kids by phone and 4,135 said yes to Jesus!

Knowing that this pandemic continues to impact many of the most vulnerable communities, we continue to pray and serve in these innovative ways. While God is still on the move, we have decided to postpone all camps until 2021. We are carefully monitoring the effects of COVID-19 globally, and ask that you continue to pray with us as we navigate ministry in this new context.

Leaders in Côte d'Ivoire were invited to join a local radio station to lead Discovery Bible Study and prayer. It went so well that the local station invited them back to do a weekly club over the radio. Leaders sing songs and worship music, read a Bible story, pray and then local kids can call in and share their testimony on the radio. The radio station also decided to be a local partner to Young Life because they have seen the great impact it has on kids.

Amidst fear and uncertainty, we remain committed to reaching kids for Jesus. As each country begins to re-open, staff is carefully implementing a "Crawl, Walk, Run" stair-stepped plan to resume face-to-face ministry. As we enter into this plan, we remain rooted in prayer for a renewed calling, refreshed training for leaders and for a deeper investment into our ministry model.





# Generational Impact in Tanzania

Although the pandemic has restricted many normal Young Life activities, the Lord is faithful and sovereign as He continues to not only reach kids, but entire families with the gospel. Irene, a Young Life leader in Tanzania, connected with Zahra who had to use her mom's phone due to not having her own. Zahra's mom became curious about who her daughter was contacting and wanted to speak with Irene. Zahra's mom, the only Christian in her family, was overjoyed to hear Irene had shared the gospel with Zahra and led her to Christ. Zahra's mom asked Irene if she would share the gospel with her entire family. The next day Irene shared the gospel over speakerphone with Zahra's whole family. After many questions, Zahra's father and brother accepted Christ. Now the whole family has come to know Jesus as their Savior! Irene and Zahra's family have a weekly virtual Bible study, during which Irene continues to share about Christ and disciple the family.

Irene's story exemplifies the countless ways that leaders are bravely continuing ministry despite the challenges of COVID. Irene faithfully embodies Young Life's Map-Tree-List model, as Zahra was on a prayer list, part of a ministry map and became a new disciple on a branch of Irene's leadership tree. We hope that Zahra's family will continue this Map-Tree-List model and grow in their faith with others.

Irene reflects, "I want to thank God and praise His name, because He has been so faithful to us during this pandemic. It has been difficult, but it has also been good—we believe that the Lord will make miracles happen. I am so grateful for the chance the Lord has provided for me to lead Zahra's family to Christ. Even though it is hard, we will always continue to do ministry as Christ leads us."

# Community Funds New Training Center

"Go further, see the effect you expect." These were the words the Lord gave to Côte d'Ivoire Regional Director Pascal Boidy (pictured bottom left). As he sat with his peers at Young Life Africa's main training center in Tanzania, Pascal realized the need for a similar center in West Africa. "It was then I decided to build a training center in honor of the Lord, without knowing myself how I was going to do it." Upon his return home, Pascal shared his ideas with a few close friends and Young Life leaders, and they quickly got to work. He fundraised locally and asked others to join with him in prayer. These leaders contributed some of their very own funds, and also received contributions from a church in their community.

After months of sacrifice and hard work, this team of local leaders finished building Young Life Africa's newest training center—the only one built entirely from local contributions.

In December 2019, the training center was officially dedicated to Young Life Africa. The center's first event hosted 16 senior leaders from across West Africa for the 2019 West Africa Leadership Team gathering. Since then, it has become a homestead for local leadership development, Bible studies and Young Life clubs. Africa West Vice President James Davis and Mali Regional Director Tiowa Diarra also host retreats and operate trainings from this base.

Pascal reflects, "I give glory to God, for I was able to fulfill the word that He spoke...I bless the name of God who made me able to do this with His help and with the help of Young Life volunteers and community in Côte d'Ivoire."









## When Heaven Invades a Jail Cell


Confused and afraid, Emmanuel, a Young Life area director, found himself in a jail cell with five other men. On his left sat Peter, one of his home country's most hated men, known as the head of a violent rebel group. On his right sat four other men in jail for extreme crimes. Emmanuel felt God tell him to start praying fervently. He prayed for a long time and then began to worship aloud. Emmanuel felt prompted to invite his cellmates to worship with him-and to his surprise they did, singing at the top of their lungs. The police came to the cell to see what was going on and, miraculously, they too began worshiping.

In East Africa, more than 800,000 refugees from two war-torn countries reside in a camp fraught with tension and hostility. In 2018, Young Life leaders started praying about this refugee camp, where 80 percent of the population is under 25 years old. Emmanuel was one of two leaders sent to start ministry within the camp. Access to the camp is extremely difficult to obtain, but Emmanuel partnered with a humanitarian group and entered the camp in December 2018. For a week, Emmanuel and his co-leader did contact work, put on clubs, and identified five leaders to continue ministry there, including one who gave his life to Christ at a Young Life camp in his home country. All of this was done in a deep spirit of prayer. However, Emmanuel needed to return home to resume his area director duties.

For many months, he longed to reconnect with these leaders in person and so, in November 2019, he traveled six hours to the refugee camp, unsure if he'd be allowed to enter. Emmanuel met with the head officer of the camp to explain his desire to visit the young refugees, but the officer did not believe him. Instead, he was convinced that Emmanuel was coming to do illegal things. The officer arrested Emmanuel and sent him to jail before a court proceeding. Emmanuel found himself behind bars in an unimaginable situation. Yet God did not leave him alone there and brought heaven into the jail cell. Four cellmates, including Peter, gave their life to Jesus, along with multiple prison guards. After this occurred, these new friends of Emmanuel asked why he was in jail and he replied,

### "I now know that I am here to preach the gospel."

Emmanuel spent two nights in jail and was released with all charges dropped. Young Life now has freedom to minister to the refugees there—so we continue to go, bringing hope to the marginalized and forgotten, to the rebel and the refugee.



Our model of raising up disciple-making volunteer leaders allows us to multiply our impact while minimizing costs. The exponential impact of this model that starts with one staff is eternal.




